

## **Recruitment Notice: Temporary [12-months] Part-time [15-hours/week] staff counsellor role**

Community Counselling [CCL] is seeking applications for the role of temporary part-time staff counsellor to help it meet the demand for brief counselling for adult victims of crime and adult clients referred to its anger management counselling service.

Initially, the role is for **15-hours per week**, for a period of **12-months**, commencing October 2021, but the aim is to increase and extend the role, subject to new funding.

The role can be split with one day working at our hub at Stanley Harrison House (next to the train station) in Malton and the other at a suitable venue in Scarborough. The role will be to provide 10 client appointments per week.

The main focus of the role will be to assess clients' suitability for service [as well as assessing for risk of self-harm] and to provide brief counselling [up to 10 sessions for victims of crime and to anger management clients] under a call-off contract with the Police, Fire, and Crime Commissioner for North Yorkshire, and longer-term counselling [up to 20 counselling sessions] to clients who have experienced domestic abuse and/or sexual abuse/violence, thanks to Ministry of Justice funding.

The salary is **£27,668** per annum pro rata. The hours can be worked flexibly subject to business needs. The role is subject to enhanced **DBS** and **police vetting** checks.
